AUGUST YOUTH CONFERENCE REPORT (supplied by Bradley Johnston):

The core philosophy behind the Annual Youth Bridge Weekends is fun, so when we (Kieran Mitchell, Matthew Baird, Nikolas Mitchell and Bradley Johnston) arrived at Christchurch we knew that we'd have a full weekend of fulfilling bridge ahead of us. Because the weekend is open to anyone under the age of 25, there was a very large skill gap – there were people who had started playing bridge three months ago up against youth provincial representatives.

In order to start shoring up this gap there were lessons held by more experienced players, including a lesson by James Coutts on the bidding and play of game hands. To lighten the mood there was also a multitude of events: "Individual" bridge where your partner switched after every board; a speed bridge section with a time of three minutes per board; a teams event; a "Play with an expert" session; and the perennial favourite of "Crazy bridge" — which is where the rules changed every board.

Are 2s joker cards? Are the partnerships N/W and S/E? How do you bid with 2 calls apiece? among other variations.

Overall the event is set up to ensure that everyone has a moment in the spotlight, but we did bring home more than our fair share of the chocolaty prizes. From when we arrived to scoring the final board, there was not a dull moment, which just highlights the primary goal of the event – learning to enjoy bridge.


South Island Pairs

Well it was a bit like the Ranfurly Shield, a hotly contested tournament, a home game for Otago, but the spoils largely went North. It is often the case that our local bridge skills can only truly be measured when we take on some of the better players from outside of Otago. Of the 28 pairs, 4 players were from the North Island, and effectively they made off with the honour and the glory as winners of the South Island Pairs, and half of 2nd in the main event, and half of the winners of the Plate event.

Michael Ware, who arguably is New Zealand's best bridge player, was part of the winning pairing. He also has the amazing claim to fame of earning sufficient masterpoints in one calendar year to achieve Grandmaster status (a minimum requirement of 1000 combined A and B points, with at least 500 being A points). With earning at most 0.4 of an A point per Club night, it could take forever to get to this level, let alone with a year!!!.

Otago was well represented in the final, with Graeme Stout and Jeff Miller finishing 3rd, and the Coutts family finishing 4th and 10th respectively. Other Otago players to feature in the final were Michael Atkinson and Peter Hall 6th, Peter McCaskill and Jeff Thompson 9th, Bob Lawrence and Ann Woodhead 13th, and Donna Ruwhiu and Kristen Collins 14th. Chris Ackerley with his Auckland and New Zealand partner was the other half of the winning Plate Pair, after their roller-coaster ride of 51%, 38%, 60%, 56%, and then 66%

One interesting hand from the qualifying session was this slam hand. Firstly can you and your regular partner bid it, and secondly can you make it? Try it on a heart lead.



Hopefully the next time the South Island Pairs is in Dunedin it can be won by a South Island Pair. As to the Ranfurly Shield, will it be another long 56 years???
