BRIDGING THE GAP

The following is regularly received on the Bridge Club email . Not sure whether I have published these in the newsletter before, but if you would like to be on their mailing list, follow the directions at the bottom.

Bridge riddle number 11.

Here it is:
You're in South in a 4♠ contract.
West leads with ♥Q.

How will you play to achieve 10 tricks?
Let your imagination have free reign.

Want to solve the riddle interactively? (See instructions below).

If you missed the previous riddles, you can solve them as well according to the instructions below.
