


This competition is open to all grades of players – some years ago the National Competition was won by a Junior pair. The 2022 Prize Money was \$1000!

#### **REAL BRIDGE PUZZLE – This Week**

**REAL BRIDGE PUZZLE – Last Week (***Playing ACOL***)** 



Hand 1

*HCPs* You can see 15 pts

The 2NT rebid shows 17 – 18 pts

So the missing card is KS or KC.

KS would give a four card spade suit

Your rebid would be spades, supporting partner, not 2NT

The missing card is King Clubs.

Hand 2

*HCPs* You can see 4 pts

The 1S reply needs 6 pts with only a four card suit

So the missing card is a KD or QH

QH would give a four card heart suit

You would reply 1H before 1S, bidding up the line.

The missing card is King Diamonds

More Bedside Bridge and The Joy of Bridge.


We have recently purchased a new book **Test Your Bridge Brain against the Experts by Danny Roth.**

Hand 1

*HCPs* You can see 10 pts

West 1S response shows a 4+card suit and only three are visible

So the missing card is KS or 6S

West did not open so has less than 12 HCPs

The missing card is 6S.

Hand 2

*HCPs* You can see 19 pts

East opened 1H, so is showing less than 20 HCPs.

So the missing card is a 2S or 2D

With five spades East would have opened 1S, the higher ranked suit

The missing card is 2D


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#### **LETTER FROM ROSS HADDOW:**

#### **REAL BRIDGE PUZZLE – Last Week**



Hand 1

*HCPs* You can see 8 pts

East opened 1C, so the missing card must be an Ace.

The AH would give five hearts so East would open 1H not 1C.

The missing card is AD.

Hand 2

*HCPs* You can see 3 pts

East's 1H response promises 6+ pts so the missing card must be a King

The KS would give five spades so East would respond 1S not 1H.


The missing card is KC.

#### WHATS YOUR SYSTEM?

Brad Johnston kindly commented on boards 5 and 6 from last Monday's teams matches.

The Coutts's pair were playing a standard strong ACOL 2NT, 20 - 22 balanced, whereas at the other table their opponent Farnden's pair played 2NT as weak 5/5 in the minors and their 1 level openings 11- 20 pts.

Read on to see which system came out best with these boards.



**Coutts' West** chose to open 2NT despite the two doubletons. East's 3C Stayman found 3S and then opted for the losing 4-3 4S game, down 1, when the spades split 4-2 rather than 3-3.

**Farnden's pair** again started low with West opening 1D. Knowing the fit was already established East checked for the major game with 1H. A reverse 2S (game forcing ??) had the diamond fit confirmed with 3D only to be passed out, much to the surprise of the defending pair.

A win in both boards this time for the Farnden's pair's 1 level openings.


#### **Brad's comments:**

#### **Board** 5

- The good long C suit is worth more than 8 HCP and supports upgrading your hand.
- If you opened 1C and partner responded 1D, jumping to 3C feels like an underbid on this hand (that could be a punchy 16 count).

**Coutts' East** stretched their 19 points (courtesy of the strong 6 card club suit and honours in all suits) into a 2NT opening. When South passed, West's 3C Stayman bid soon became 3NT and -2 after the KH, AH lead dropped the QH for the first six tricks.

**Farnden's East** simply had no choice but to open 1C...1H overcall and negative X to show just 4 spades. East looked for game with a 2H cue-bid (tell me more, partner) but with a 2S (nothing more to tell) reply settled for 3C making 4.



- Likewise, after 1C (1H) X P with no heart hold 3C seems a cheap sell out, so East's 2H cue of "strong hand, nothing sensible to do" was the ideal alternative.
- The following 2S 3C sequence of shows a "Three-and-a-half club bid", which is a good description of the hand
- Leading out the hearts by South looks safe as knowing where 32+ points are there is no guarantee there is any entry in partner's hand and for them to guess a heart lead.
- South also has the KD which looks offside for another entry if the QH must be driven out at trick 3.

#### Board 6

- The option to open 2NT, doesn't look optimum with 80% of your strength in 2 suits and no difficult rebid problems.
- Responding to partner's reverse bid is a test to your system;
  - How strong is partner to reverse bid?
  - Would 2NT in this sequence be to play, or just a negative waiting response?
  - Is 3D invitational into a minor game or NT game but denying any club hold?
- Holding 20 points and partner responds to your opener is game not on?
- The 3D reply almost guarantees you can count 8 tricks and with the likely lead the unbid club suit into your Kx, making the 3NT game.
  - $\circ$  The outcome could have been worse for the Coutts team....
