#### LAW OF TOTAL TRICKS

The Law of Total Tricks (LoTT or the LAW) is a bidding guideline developed by Jean-Rene Vernes. It helps you to decide how high to compete, using this approximation:

With 8 partnership trumps, bid to the 2-level.

With 9 trumps--3 level.

With 10 trumps--4 level.

The following assumes opening 5 card majors, but you can adapt if you play 4-card majors.

If responder to 1S holds: SQ76 H54 D108765 C653, and hears partner open 1S, he knows his side has 8 trumps. He won't raise immediately to 2, because that would be a lie. Bids still mean what they always meant and raising to 2 shows 6-10. So, responder has to pass, but he knows that if the opponents now balance (say 1S-P-P-2H) that he should be willing to compete to 2S since the partnership has 8 trumps. It doesn't mean 2S will make, but even if it is down, that is likely better than defending against 2H (likely making).

Similarly, if responder to 1S holds: SQ876 H62 D64 CK8764, he knows his side has 9 trumps. He can't raise to 3 since that would be invitational. But, later, if he has to, he should compete to the 3-level (1S P 2S P; P 3H 3S)

With 5 trumps responder, to 1S will raise to 4S (which is defined as 5 trumps and weakish. Example: SKJ876 H5 D8432 C 832.

Over Partner's 2-level pre-empt (6 cards), be willing to compete to the 3-level with 3-card support (9 total trumps) and the 4-level with 4-card support (10 total trumps). After a 3-level pre-empt by partner, assume a 7-card suit and use the LAW accordingly.

# **Changes to Board Requirements for 5A to 20A Tournaments**

The Board of NZBridge has agreed to adopt the following changes to the board requirements for certain tournament levels. The change is effective immediately and will be reviewed in 12 months' time.

•5A 48 - 60 boards
 •10A 60 - 72 boards
 •15A 72 - 96 boards
 •20A 96 -120 boards

The rationale behind the change is to give directors and event organisers some flexibility when considering the number of tables in play and the time available. This will be particularly useful for mini congress events held over 2 -3 days or more.

Rather than focusing on a minimum number of boards they are implementing a range depending on the level of the event. As is the case already, the minimum number must be played. However there will be instances where it is appropriate to exceed the upper end in the range and this is acceptable.

#### FROM ALLAN MORRIS, NZ BRIDGE CHAIRMAN, in his most recent NEWSLETTER ..

Finally I leave you with the message - be kind and polite to your partner and to your opponents. We should not condone in any way bad or inappropriate behaviour. What I hear all the time from beginners is inappropriate behaviour puts them off joining clubs and playing. So I ask before you say anything or act in any fashion that might be discourteous or offensive or inappropriate, please think!!.
