

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING was held last Monday night with a good attendance. Congratulations to the new members elected to the Management Committee - Rob Lawson, Neil Johnstone and Paul Spain. The meeting was chaired by Vice-President Alan Geare, in the unavoidable absence of President Paul Hudson. Questions asked of the Committee under General included:

• Plastic cups – with the continuing controversy disposing of plastic waste it was felt that it was time to dispense with these as well as the use of plastic bag liners in our rubbish bins. President Alan replied that the Committee had addressed this issue earlier in the year.

Because they envisaged that it would be difficult to get volunteers to wash the arcoroc cups regularly we would be continuing with the plastic cups, but the Committee will investigate alternatives. In the meantime it was suggested that people bring along their own cups to use.
